

## REQUIREMENTS

- Title, Authors, Institution(s), Contact Information
- Abstract
- Overview/summary of legal issue or policy topic: (a) Authors are encouraged to choose topics neither too narrow nor broad; (b) Topics of a controversial nature or those that have sparked intense interest are preferred (e.g., the “Bathroom Bill,” specific accountability policies, school choice models); (c) Brief explanation of the issue, and (d) A core legal or policy question must be identified in closing of this section
- Explanation of education, law and or policy research relevant to the problem (a) Use of theories, research, and or case law to provide context for the problem; (b) Balanced coverage of the competing political postures on the issue; (c) Balanced coverage of alternative policy/legal strategies to address the issue; (d) Clear and well organized narrative, (e) Use of colored graphs and tables is allowed
- Conclusions and takeaways
- Bullets/Lists
- Recommendations (for policymakers, practitioners, and or researchers)
- References APA Publication Manual (6th Edition) must be followed, no more than 3000 to 4000 words total, and the use of bullets or numbered lists in the conclusions and recommendations is preferred.
